OPENING

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING Minutes accepted.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Members have been notified of the proposed changes to Standing Resolutions, including the proposed membership fee increase. Discussion on these items has been a component of the past three meetings and issues covered in the newsletter.


The President reminded members that 75% of those active members present and voting would be required to pass these proposals. The membership officer informed the meeting that 69 active members were present, so the number in the affirmative would be 52. Garth Juster and Margaret Conley were appointed to count hands.

Australian Filmmaker

Gill Regnis introduced Richard Snashall, son of Norbert, who gave a visual presentation of his work and travels throughout the world.

In the past 20 years Richard has travelled to many countries, filming, recording and making unique films for television and the web, as well as producing stories for ABC radio and ABC online. His work has also been screened internationally. He works on projects relating to travel, agriculture and fisheries, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island health and culture and environmental issues among others. The advent of digital video equipment in the late 1990s enabled him to work on his own, covering all facets of the production process.



As well as producing many cameos of Australian rural life, Richard has done programs on overseas cities. One series is called *Down Under* and focuses on Australians in Singapore, St Petersburg, Budapest, Glasgow, Dallas and Montreal. In another program, *Down Under Paris*, Richard meets artistic Australians, and uses the Metro as a link between his subjects and a window to the city.

A third documentary, Troubled: A Personal



Look at Northern Ireland, looks at Northern Ireland 30 years after the commencement of 'The Troubles.' It features interviews with a range of people from all political and religious backgrounds.

Richard showed scenes from his documentaries in his presentation. His overseas adventures have seen him branch into writing travel stories and reviews and running unique tours to Japan and Taiwan.
