President's Report to the AGM



When I began the journey as your President 12 Months ago, I wanted to further the aims and objectives as stated in our Constitution which include being seen as a worthwhile organisation by the local community, holding regular meetings and social activities with opportunities for advancing intellectual and cultural interests of members, and of course providing opportunities for fellowship, friendship and fun.

And you know, I think that we have achieved these goals. I say we, because it is a team effort and what a great team I had to work with.

Mike Allum as the vice President who overcame serious illness to keep contributing, and even got the newsletter out, on time Garth Juster, immediate past President, who provided me with great support and wise counsel

Margaret Timbs as Secretary, quietly undertook the many facets of her quite complex role

Judith Butt, Treasurer who is wondrously efficient Carol Pelham as Speakers Convenor, who finds speakers of amazing variety and of interest to us all

Gordon Sanson, Membership convenor, has thoughtfully gone about the role and made useful suggestions for change

Ashlyn Allum has taken on any role asked of her, including working with the tea committee

Peter Kelly in the Welfare role has kept up-to-date with our times of unwellness, and worked with Jill and Wendell on the fourth Anniversary Lunch remembering Changi

And Jill Regnis, more-than-well-deserved recipient of the 2018 North Sydney Community Award, Jill, supported by Mike has been the tireless Activities Convenor who has organised so many activities for members, all of which have met the objectives of cultural enrichment as well as fellowship, friendship and fun.

Thank you to you all. And while it has been a challenge to limit Management Committee meetings to an hour, they have all been productive and good humoured and I am pleased that I get to enjoy those meetings for another year as the Immediate Past President.

As Probus members, an average of 72% of us attend each meeting, and most of those who are unable to attend make sure they register apologies. With apologies, our average is 92%. Congratulations to each of you.

We continue to have a small waiting list, so it is clear that members talk positively about the Club and we are seen as a worthwhile organisation in the local community. I have had the pleasure of welcoming 10 new members into membership. This kind of renewal is important for the Club so we can continue to fill the 25 voluntary positions that help make our Club run so well.

Our equipment, including the honour boards, bell, sound and computing equipment has been insured for the first time. And as a Club, we modified some of the Standing Resolutions, and these may be revisited later this year to separate policy from the standing resolutions as suggested by one of our members. Our finances dipped when we needed to upgrade our sound and computer equipment early in 2018. Your Management Committee has searched for ways to cut expenditure and increase income, and that will continue. Garth has estimated that the cost per member is \$70, while our membership fee is \$50. So, keep buying raffle

Activities over the year have included: well-attended Christmas and President's lunches, the Changi lunch, a memorable cruise on Port Hacking, trips to Goat Island, the Cartier Exhibition, the Jew-

ish Museum, Blackheath for the Rhododendron Festival, our recent Birthday dinner and the (forthcoming) Melbourne Flower Show. Trips planned to Dubbo and Newcastle had to be cancelled because of inadequate registrations which was a pity.

Speakers on topics such as Macarthur, the Aquatic Airman, NSW Police Force front line, the Japanese attack on Sydney Harbour, Deborah Wallace on Crime, Official Visitors (mental health), Monty Dwyer, Foundation for National Parks and Wildlife, Eternity Man and NSW Mounted Police have entertained and informed us. The Cafe Club ceased during last year and Opal days have provided variety like the Jacaranda Cruise and the Biennale on Cockatoo Island. Any member can offer to lead an Opal activity, like the one I will do my best to do later this month to Kiama. And Jill has let us know about movies and found good tickets for us at Town Hall concerts.

A few things I hoped to do but did not manage included starting a walking group and gaining more coverage for the Club in the local newspaper, TWT. And while the ideas to do something completely different like (indoor) sky diving, line dancing, zip lining or salsa dancing - did not enjoy a stampede of volunteers, I now hand on these member recruitment ideas to Mike.

I joined this Probus Club to get to know some people with similar interests in Hunters Hill. That 2016 decision has worked a treat. Thank you.

I did want my year as your President to reinforce the existing Club culture of respect and harmony, and from where I sit this has been achieved. It has been an honour to be your 43rd President, I am the 11th woman to serve our Club in that role.

And, thank you to all those who volunteer their time for the Club and thank you to all members, you have all made my term one I shall treasure.

I wish the incoming President and his Committee a happy, healthy, joyful and successful year.
