Top Cop's Life in Crime

Deirdre Page welcomed back Superintendent The police used the Restricted Premises Act Deb Wallace of the NSW Police Force to give us and the Consorting Act to close club houses

an update on her activities in the State Crime Command. Deb has just celebrated 36 years in the police force, including 14 vears at Cabramatta Local Area Command.

Deb joined State Crime Command in 2003 and is now Commander. State Crime Command Gangs Squad, covering Asian, Middle Eastern and outlaw motorcycle gangs. She has a staff of 280 and has lectured to police in the USA and Europe on criminal gangs.



The SCC now concentrates on outlaw motor cycle gangs (OMCGs). There are about 20 OMCGs throughout Australia, with Sydney having about 50% of the total membership. To better understand what makes these gangs tick, she spoke to younger police, who pointed out some characteristics. Members like to intimidate, move in packs and are capable of extreme violence. They gather in club houses, which they call 'church' on Friday nights. No women are present. They like to go on runs, wearing their club 'patches'; they are involved in tattoo parlours, the security industry (pub bouncers) and illegal drugs and weapon importing.
