The Lunch was sponsored by www.myguardianfoundation.com.au to celebrate, for the first time in Australian history, "100 years of life, legacy and inspiration" at NSW Parliament, This resulted in 150 people, born in 1925 or earlier, and each one celebrating their long life. The longest lives at the Function were recorded by two ladies, both with the given name of Edna, and both born in 1916. It is amazing to think that in their lifetime these people have witnessed the manufacture and development of the motor car as our regular means of transport, Sydney without a Harbour Bridge, King George V was on the Throne.

This event was organised by the aged care provider, My Guardian in collaboration with the NSW Government, the event was a celebration of Australia's oldest living citizens, and the 150 attendees including veterans, Holocaust survivors, pioneering migrants, educators, entrepreneurs, parents and everyday heroes. I feel privileged that Ruth Cronk invited me to act as her carer for the day and so witness this grand celebration. It is an inspiration for our Probus members, that they may aim to qualify and join the invitation list in future times!



In 2003, at the age of seventeen, South Australian schoolgirl Hannah Kent visited Iceland as an exchange student. Twenty years later she published her debut novel, *Burial Rites*, based on the haunting story of Agnes Magnúsdóttir, the last woman executed (in 1829) in Iceland. The novel won many awards, has been translated into over 30 languages and is being adapted for film.

Always Home, Always Homesick is a memoir of Hannah's experiences in that beautiful and mysterious country, which she has come to love as a second home. It tells of the people who embraced her and are now her second family. It also recounts her efforts both then, and on subsequent visits, to research and publish the novel.

Several members of our panel had read and enjoyed *Burial Rites*. In *Always Home, Always Homesick* even those who had known nothing of that work found something to appreciate beyond the author's beautifully poetic writing style – even though the details of the various local literary luminaries she met and the conferences she attended did become pretty tedious.

For our November 21st meeting we are forming our opinions of *Lyrebird*, a mystery thriller by local author Jane Caro.

The November Exotic lunch will be held at "TOTO's" 59 First Avenue Five Dock, Rodd Point at 1:00 pm Friday, 14th November.

Please note that, like last September, it will be Italian style, share all, lunch.

Along with the restaurant owners, I will choose, and order, a selection of antipasti, salads, pizzas, pastas and Gnocchi's.

Toto's does not sell liquor, but is BYO, wine only and doesn't charge corkage or for the wine glasses. Soft drink, deserts, gelato, coffee, etc should be paid by you.

Pat and Vincie are two lovely people who so richly deserve accolades for their achievements, and who have now been awarded their 30 years' service badges. Both have contributed so much. They have served on the Management Committee, and been Presidents of the club: Pat for three separate terms – a record! The final formal event was for Josephine to present Pat and Vincie, a plaque commemorating that significant event way back in 1995.



- * I intend to live forever. So far, so good.


